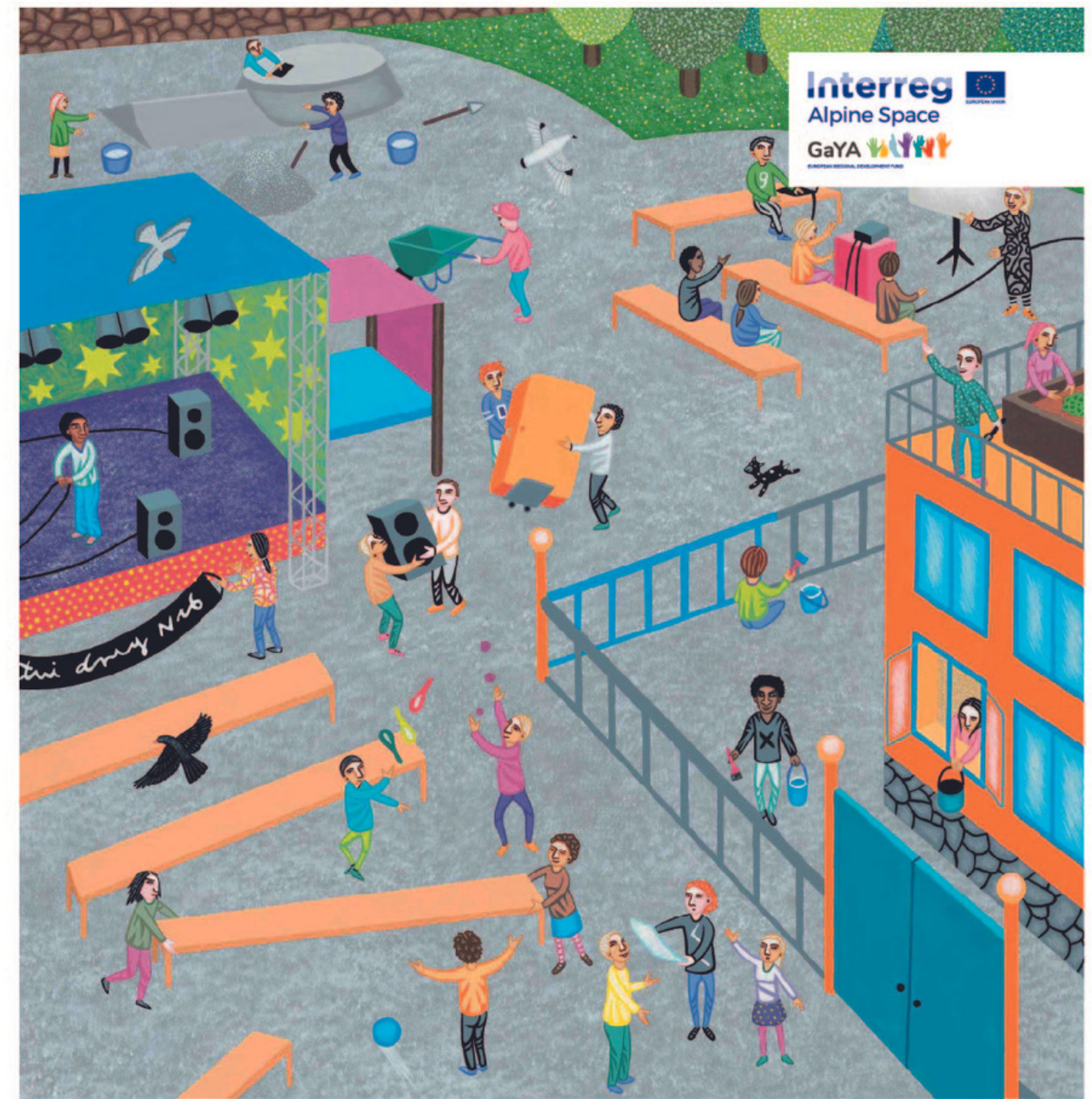

(1) IMPROVE COORDINATION BETWEEN ORGANISATIONS AT ALL LEVELS OF GOVERNMENT AND GOVERNANCE

- **Bring people together with new formats**
- **Invest time in building personal relationships**
- **Clarify roles, responsibilities and expectations**



(2) DEVELOP AND IMPLEMENT PLACE-SPECIFIC ACTION RESPONDING TO TERRITORIAL NEEDS TO FOSTER INTEGRATED PLACE-BASED APPROACHES;

- **Focus on borders perceived by people**
- **Assessment of territorial needs**
- **Cross-border functional areas**

(3) INVOLVE RELEVANT STAKEHOLDERS AND CITIZENS THROUGHOUT THE POLICY CYCLE TO ADOPT BOTTOM-UP AND PARTICIPATORY APPROACHES
