



Social innovation definition/concept

- SOCIAL addresses social or societal needs
- INNOVATION novel approaches or solutions
- SOCIAL INNOVATION based on a collaborative approach that includes beneficiaries

Social innovations are "innovations that are social both in their ends and in their means." (The Young Foundation, Open Book of Social Innovation)

Findings – why does Interreg need social innovation?

Social innovation projects can

- inspire change in the public sector and provide better and/or cost-saving solutions for delivery of public/social services
- help in making territorial and social imbalances visible and overcoming them
- stimulate inclusive economic development, by creating (self-)employment as well as business opportunities in social entrepreneurship
- make regions more attractive places to live and work in, e.g. by improving accessibility or improving participation in public decision-making
- broaden the range of actors and lower thresholds for participation in transnational cooperation



Findings – why does social innovation need Interreg?

Transnational cooperation can

- help public authorities develop, evaluate and benchmark social innovation strategies and funding schemes and improve the social innovation ecosystem
- help find new solutions to societal changes that are the same, but under socioeconomic conditions that are different in the regions
- make it possible to test new and unproven approaches
- help create a critcal mass in (rural/lagging) regions where the knowledge base is weak
- provide a stimulus for organisational learning and rethinking of working structures and methods



Social innovation in 2021-2027 – Observations

- Social innovation projects have proven their value in 2014-2020
- Programming processes are almost finalised:
 - Social innovation seems to be a topic just as much as previously
 - More focus on social innovation being a means than an end: social innovation in connection with Green Deal objectives

farm2fork
climate change mitigation
circular economy
mobility

- Territorial cohesion and just transformation remain important topics (Territorial Agenda)
- COVID-19 effects seem to have affected programming (focus on resilience, importance of digitisation and equal access to it)



Social innovation in 2021-2027 – Recommendations for Programmes

- Lower the thresholds for participation (e.g. of smaller NGOs)!
 - Pre- and co-financing is difficult
 - Allow smaller projects and micro projects
- Allow and accept open processes with uncertain results!
 - Be flexible, accept results that deviate from the original plan
 - More qualitative evaluation, visit projects to see the change they make
- More exchange between projects and programme areas (socialinterreg.eu can continue to be a platform)!



Social innovation in 2021-2027 – Recommendations for Projects

- Be more and less ambitious at the same time!
 - Don't make projects too complex, focus on key issues
 - In these key issues, strive to achieve great results
- Work cross-sectorally!
 - Bring together the established welfare sector, the public sector and the social entrepreneurship scene!
 - Combine social themes with green themes
- Bring about organisational change!
 - Start with your own organisations, don't forget your colleagues as a target group!
